


The Pass-the-Plate Devos

1. Who did Gabriel the angel visit?
2. Mary was troubled by her visit with the angel – and you certainly couldn’t blame her. Today, we might think of angels as being cute human-like people with wings. However, Gabriel was an archangel of Almighty God, and he might have looked ready for battle. Some have even called Gabriel the “Angel of Death.” However, Gabriel came not to talk about death, but about life. What did the angel say to Mary?

4. To show Mary that nothing is impossible with God, the angel brought her news about her relative? What exciting news did he tell her?
5. What did Mary say to the angel when the angel was done speaking?

Bible Focus: Luke 1:26-38

In the sixth month, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you."

Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favor with God. You will be with child and give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever; his kingdom will never end." "How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"

The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. FAMILY CHALLENGE
